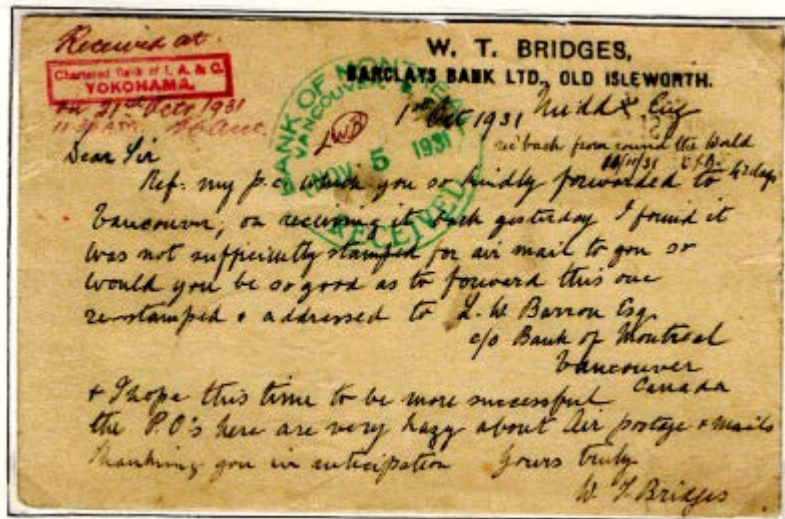

**The cover of the quarter**



This postal stationery card, here and overleaf, was sent as an experiment **from Isleworth, Middlesex** to try to have it **circumnavigate** the northern hemisphere in 1931 (1/10/31). Post marks show that it travelled via **Berlin**, and so **Paris** first, and **by German Air Mail**, probably to **Moscow** and then on to the **trans-Siberian Railway to Vladivostok**, reaching **Yokohama** in Japan by 21<sup>st</sup> October where it received a red 6 sen stamp for onward postage to **Canada**. A further 6 cents in stamps were added in **Vancouver**, leaving there on 5<sup>th</sup> November and arriving in London on 14<sup>th</sup> November, having taken 45 days for its journey, courtesy of International Banking colleagues. It has a **Bradbury Wilkinson 2/6 Seahorse** to cover the major part of the postage.

This was not the first time that Mr W T Bridges had tried this, but it seems that he was successful this time.

1. 1876 8D PURPLE-BROWN UNISSUED (SG156a) WITH CANCELLATION. Used example of the 1876 unissued 8d purple-brown (SG156a) lettered HF with LONDON squared circle MR 11 86. RPS cert. 159781 states "prepared for use but not issued - used - is genuine. Thins - wing margin reperfected - creased - fortuitous late usage". Only two examples of this rare stamp with cancellations are known, one ex. Charles Nissen, this example ex. Latto collection. (Ref 112871). £4000.00



2. 1D GREY-BLACK PL.10 (SG3)(CC) STATE II (SPEC AS68) ON COVER EYE (SUFFOLK) TO HALESWORTH. Fine letter Eye to "Messrs Gurneys and Co. Bankers Halesworth" 17th March 1841 with fine to very fine used 1d grey-black pl.10 (SG3) lettered CC, four close but clear to fine margins, tied very fine black M.C. of Eye. On reverse EYE date stamp MR 17 1841. Stamp in STATE II OF THE PLATE (spec AS68), showing FAINT SE RAY FLAW NE SQUARE AND ABSENCE OF O FLAW. RPS cert. 210523. Ex Tom Slemmons exhibit who recorded 322 1d blacks used on cover in Suffolk but only 4 from pl.10 all used from Eye in March 1841 Exhibition quality, ex Lady Mairi Bury. (Ref 113385).
