### MAPF Competitions and Convention 2019

A reminder that competition entries in the form of photocopies need to with me (1 Devon Crescent, North Wootton, King's Lynn PE30 3QZ **by the 30<sup>th</sup> April**, please).

A note also about **the extra classes** now available: postal stationery, revenues, picture post cards and Cinderellas; AND the **revised mark schemes** particularly to increasing marks for presentation and correspondingly reducing marks for rarity, which often equates to the deeper pockets of the very serious international level collector.

Finally we are minded to adopt the ABPS Federation level recommended awards, subject to the committees' agreement, with the following effects if accepted:

Silver Gilt	80	--
Large Vermeil	--	75 -79
Vermeil	--	70 – 74

Large Silver	75	65 - 69
Silver	70	60 – 64

If adopted, then large vermeil and vermeil would replace its equivalent of silver gilt. There would also be the award of a certificate/diploma for 40 – 49 marks.

## London 2020

This major international show with full FIP status takes place at the British Design Centre, Islington in early May next year (2<sup>nd</sup> to 9<sup>th</sup>). The whole of the main building will be filled with around 130 dealers and auction houses from over 20 countries. Several major ‘rooms’ at the upper, gallery level will cater for over 2 500 frames of exhibits whose displays will be changed after 4 days to accommodate all the classes available. Additional **self adhesive stamps** have now been added to the range as set out in August and November newsletters, as follows:

\*\*\* This printing has a bright fluor additive to the to the phosphor bands, whereas the 5p printing from the RAF Centenary booklet had dull fluor additive.

\*\*\* For the specialist collector the current norm for the printed backing paper on self adhesive stamps is Type 2 which has pairs of upright and inverted “Royal Mail” wavy lines. These two booklets’ stamps have reverted to Type 1 backing paper where all the lines are oriented in the same direction. Those stamps from the Harry Potter booklet seen so far, all have the backing paper inverted.
