It is with sadness that we note the demise of another philatelic society. **Fenland PS** based in Wisbech finally closed their doors at the end of April. This is in spite of the sterling efforts of Richard Lewis (secretary), Richard Moss FRPSL (treasurer) and Paul Lascelles (acting chairman) over last few years to keep meetings going with a fine group of invited speakers. They will be missed.

#### Cover of the Quarter

During the 1790s several different FREE hand stamps were introduced as a way of fighting back against the widespread abuse of the privilege for MPs, members of the House of Lords, Bishops and named officers of the Government. Postage was so expensive that there are many letters where the signature et cetera are not in the same hand as the signature!

There was a restriction on the numbers of FREE letters that could be sent each day (10) and received (15). To enable this – as best they could – letters had to be endorsed with the signature of the sender, which was recorded and kept for reference at the relevant department at London's head post office. At the top of the letter the sender also had to write the name of the nearest post town and the date in full.

It should also be noted that only letters coming into, out of or through London were given hand stamps. Mail NOT travelling thus received NO FREE hand stamp at all. All of this made keeping control of FREE letters was rather difficult!

The letter, below, was sent by an unidentified member of the House of Lords from Sevenoaks to the College of Arms in London. On posting it received a strike of the curved Sevenoaks hand stamp, **KT 1028**, and on arrival in the capital a fine strike of the Free Frank mark, **L 786**.

#### **Autumn Stampex**

A real exhibition, this time, and not a virtual one, will be held at the British Design Centre from 23<sup>rd</sup> to 26<sup>th</sup> October. This year it will be based in the Atrium Hall and the Gallery, up at the gallery level, above the usual main floor.

The list of dealers taking part is on the Stampex website, but I note there are no French stamp dealers and several new faces, including Ascension Island.

#### **Europlilex 2025**

Less than a year to the next big international philatelic exhibition at the NEC in May next year.

Up to date details can be seen on the website, which currently shows only 40 trade stand holders, but otherwise looks like being a much larger show than its predecessors in London.

#### The British County catalogues

The East Anglia Postal History Society has embarked on updating the records for our local counties in this excellent set of books of which the 2<sup>nd</sup> edition was published in 1996.

Much material has come on the market since then and many new hand stamps and earliest and latest dates have come to light. Tom Slemons has written a superb book on Suffolk Postal History to 1844 (Stuart Rossiter Trust), and more recently an excellent update for Lincolnshire, written by Frank Wilson, has appeared in the Eastern Angle, the EAPHS' quarterly journal.
