### King Charles III new barcoded Machin Definitives with Peter Morton

This is a very brief update to my 10<sup>th</sup> August summary.

Since that time a further prestige booklet entitled 'The Who' was released on  $17^{th}$  October 2024. The definitive barcoded Machin pane contains 2 x £2.00 stamps. These were printed in gravure by Cartor in France and have the usual M24L and MPIL format. The gravure style of printing agrees with the information released by Royal Mail.

Some discrepancies have arisen with the methodology of printing for the Machin barcoded pane with several of the Charles III prestige booklets'

The first booklet, 'Shirley Bassey', has the definitive Machin printed in litho, which agrees with the information released by Royal Mail.

The second and third prestige booklets printed in 2023, namely 'Harry Potter' and also 'Spice Girls', had the definitive pane printed in litho, despite Royal Mail indicating it was printed in photogravure.

The fourth and fifth prestige booklets printed in 2024, namely 'Dungeons & Dragons' and 'Red Arrows', had the definitive Machin pane printed in photogravure, despite Royal Mail indicating they were printed in litho.

I trust the above now clarifies the position.

This letter was sent by James Graham who was the MP for Ripon at this time in June 1804.

However, there is a problem with the correspondence; it is too heavy for being able to be carried free of charge.

As it **weighed more than I ounce**, a restriction imposed in 1795, it was struck with London's '**Above Privilege**' hand stamp, **LP 7**, and **charged 3/- postage**, quadruple rate for the distance of 215 miles from London to Wrexham.
