Welcome to the spring newsletter with updates on this year's competitions with some major changes and implications for the future.

Annual competitions

The committee has decided that we should change the approach to the 9 sheet competitions.

While it is generally accepted that this format is more difficult to do well than the larger format with 16 sheets, it has been decided to make the 9 sheet classes to be developmental and to encourage new collectors to competing.

To this end we have **changed the marking scheme** to match this approach, with, for instance, fewer marks for rarity and more for research, philatelic knowledge and presentation.

Also, we have introduced a requirement that these classes – still in the same 3 categories, traditional, postal history and thematic – are only open to those who have NOT previously attained a large silver (75 - 80), or above, in Federation competitions.

All photocopied entries, which should include **an extra copy** of the introductory page, should be sent to John Spencer by **14**th **May**, to enable the panel of judges time to make their deliberations and the production of certificates and individual mark sheets with judges' comments.

All entries will then be displayed at our Convention as part of Philanglia on 21st June at the Burgess Hall, St Ives, PE27 6WU. Presentations will be made at midday.

Extraordinary General Meeting

Your committee have decided to change our constitution to make the dates for the AGM, more flexible, than just being held in the autumn, and also to allow the meeting to take place via Zoom, should conditions require it – such as the pandemic.

The meeting has been called for 11:30 am on 21st June at Philanglia, prior to the awards being presented. There will be just this one item on the agenda.

Display Day and AGM, 2025

John Spencer has arranged this again, many thanks, for Sunday, 28th September at Warmington Village Hall, which is on Church Street, PE8 6TE. More details will follow.

Europhilex 2025

Every ten years when the date ends in a 5, Europhilex shows are staged. They are held under the aegis of FEPA, the Association for Europe, as opposed to the FIP, which oversees the exhibitions in the UK when the year date ends in '0'.

For the first time one of these major exhibitions is being held outside London. At the NEC, there is more space, dealers can drive to their stands, access from road and rail is easy and there is plenty of parking on site. A further advantage for the organisers in that it is less expensive than the British Design Centre in London.

There will be over 56 dealers present, though very few from Europe, as a result of increased border controls in the last few years. There will also be up to 2 000 frames of exhibits from 40 countries and over 30 philatelic society meetings during the 5 days of the show.



An 'Apple' free mark from London in 1801 permits Sir Robert Mackreth, former MP for Castle Rising (1774 – 84) to send this letter to Berwick.

He started out as an assistant at White's Club in London, married the wealthy daughter of the owner, and became an agent selling large country properties and money lender to asset rich land owners. He was found guilty of a £28 000 fraud and required to repay the money.

Despite this he was knighted in 1795 and retired from Parliament in 1802 to continue his financial dealings, including being a bookmaker, and buying a plantation in the West Indies. He died in 1819.


